

Travelling to Lisbon (by air)

The closest airport to the meeting place is the Humberto Delgado Airport aka Lisbon (International) Airport (IATA: LIS, Web: www.lisbonairport.pt) – the main Portuguese airport!

The airport is the main hub of Portugal's flag carrier TAP Air Portugal, and many well-known carriers have direct flights to/from the Lisbon Airport, including low-cost airlines such as EasyJet (all outbound from Terminal 1) and Ryanair (outbound from Terminal 2).

In is typically fast to get from airport entrance to any gate (and vice-versa) passing through security. Suggested Hacks (for when you go back home):

- Terminal 1: You can buy a Fast Track pass for 11€ (in a machine close to the security entrance) which largely accelerates passing through security as there is a dedicated area for the Fast Track holders.
- Terminal 1: If you use the standard security area (above), try to go for the rightmost scanning machines as these are the new ones and you don't need to take any electronics out of the bag(s).
- Beware of what is shown on the screens that might be incorrect sometimes flight is already boarding while it still says "Go To Gate" on the screens. Be sure to be close to the gate to have a visual on boarding status.

Out of the airport (& Moving in Lisbon)

Mobility-as-a-Service (TVDE vehicles)

- Lisbon is served by popular MaaS platforms
 - At a given point in time, one might be providing a better price that other(s) – you need to check on-demand on the mobile Apps
- TVDE is the suggested way to move by car in Lisbon and go from Airport to the Venue/Hotel





Metro (Metropolitano Lisboa)

- Lisbon city has an efficient underground metro
 - Airport metro station: Aeroporto (T1), Red line
 - Beware that there is no Metro to the Hotel/Venue and you will need to commute several times/modes to get there using public transportation!



- The metro spans the city and is the most effective & cheapest way to move inside the city (Lisbon)

Taxi

- Use of taxi is acceptable & non-expensive
 - @Airport: advise you to take the taxi at the Departures (right outside the terminal building), not at the Arrivals. You hail for the passing taxis that deliver passengers to the airport.
 - <u>Note</u>: suggest you ask for invoice ("fatura" in Portuguese) for tracking any issue with the taxi driver invoice is printed, never handwritten!!!
- Lisbon taxis are painted **black** & **green** colour and can be hailed from the streets or found in taxi stops.

Other mobility options

- Bus & Tram (Eléctrico) COTTIS
- Lisbon is well-served by buses & trams that traverse the city
- Bus exists from Lisbon to the Venue, but you need to take it either at Marquês do Pombal or Sete Rios, in Lisbon city

Venue: TRYP Lisboa Caparica Mar Hotel 4*

The TRYP Lisboa Caparica Mar Hotel has a relaxing and carefree atmosphere and is located right on the sea, on the largest and most popular beach in the Greater Lisbon region – the Costa da Caparica. The hotel is located just some 20 minutes from downtown Lisbon and the Lisbon International airport.

The **amazing landscape of this coast** calls for walks alongside the seafront promenade. The 30km-long sandy beach spanning from Protected Landscape of Arriba Fóssil to the Fonte da Telha beach is among one of the region's greatest natural assets.

Hotel venue is ~25km (~30mins) out of Lisbon airport – best way to reach is by TVDE (Uber, Bolt) or Taxi:

- <u>Airport→Hotel</u>: On rush hours (after 16h~17h) it might take longer to get pass the Tagus bridge due to high traffic.
- Hotel→Airport: On rush hours (before 10h) beware that it might take longer (2x or more) to get to the airport.
- Note: be sure to reserve sufficient time in-advance, check traffic on Maps Apps and, in the very extreme case that all is blocked (accident), consider the Fertagus train (<u>www.fertagus.pt</u>) that moves under bridge (Pragal →Lisbon)

The 4-star Mercure Lisboa Almada hotel is located a short drive from the beaches of Costa da Caparica and 1.4 km from the iconic Cristo Rei. Modern rooms offer picturesque views of Almada. Lisbon's popular historic centre is 9 km away, with emblematic areas such as Chiado, Rossio and Bairro Alto. E.g. the spicy Malagueta pepper from the Americas; the Cataplana inspired in the Moroccan "Tajine"; or even the famous Portuguese Bacalao (dried & salted codfish) does not exist in Portugal – it was originally caught in "Terra Nova" (Newfoundland, an island situated off the eastern coast of Canada) and nowadays comes from Norway/Iceland; etc.








Weather @ Lisbon

- In Lisbon, the climate is Mediterranean, with mild, rainy winters (December to February) and warm, sunny summers (June to mid-September).
- Temperature: Average temperature of the coldest month (January) is ~8°C. Average temperature of the warmest month (August) is ~29°C.

 Humidity: The muggier period of the year in Lisbon lasts for some 5 months, going from mid-June to mid-November.



Humidity Comfort Levels in Lisbon (2014-2021) [1]



Electricity in Portugal

- The standard voltage is 230V and the frequency is 50 Hz
- Plug socket: type F
 - Also known as "Schuko"
 - Works with plug C & plug E
